## My Faith Journey

Five years ago I met Ron, my present husband. He too was a believer and had a strong faith. He was not Catholic when I met him and again, on his own, he decided to convert to the Catholic faith. He too says prayers before every meal and believes in being an active church and community volunteer. I continue to grow in my faith with Ron.

So what is the consistent thread in my faith journey? I have been blessed to be surrounded by a family of believers. God has always had an active presence in my life and as I get older I realize more and more how important it is to nourish my faith by surrounding myself with believers.
